PROGRAM

MONDAY, OCTOBER 15

Arrive in Jerusalem for the most spectacular Hadassah Convention ever. Gather with your friends and colleagues for dinner together or enjoy a free evening.

Evening: Keepers of the Gate reception for members and Associates who are committed to this annual gift level.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 16

Morning: Program Track- See explanation below

Afternoon: Convention officially begins as we march, sing, dance and cheer through the streets in downtown Jerusalem. We will follow the torch that was relayed from Israel through communities around the United States and brought home to Jerusalem. Get ready to celebrate with a Flash Mob Dance and official opening ceremonies at Safra Square.

Evening: A lavish buffet dinner is served at each Convention hotel. Delegates will be joined by our Hadassah Medical Organization management, staff and guests from Israel for the largest dedication in 50 years, the Sarah Wetsman Davidson Hospital Tower. We will rejoice at the Israel Convention Center as we dedicate Hadassah's Centennial gift to the people of Israel.

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 17

Morning: Our day begins together at Hadassah Neurim, our Youth Aliyah Village on the Mediterranean Sea, where we will salute all of Hadassah's projects. This beautiful site will be host to a "Happening" giving each delegate an opportunity to interact with unique project experiences and celebrate our incredible accomplishments in education, youth work, land reclamation and medicine.

Evening: Founders Dinner for donors at the Founders level or higher. Young Hadassah from the United States, Israel and around the world will dance and mingle at a cool Jerusalem club. Or enjoy a free evening to explore Jerusalem's wonderful shops, restaurants and cafés.

THREE PROGRAM TRACKS

Each delegate and registered guest will experience all three tracks at different times during the Convention.

Track - SARAH WETSMAN DAVIDSON HOSPITAL TOWER See, touch and feel the pulse of this incredible building as we tour and meet the staff.

Track - JEWISH EDUCATION PROGRAM We will be privileged to participate in a fabulous learning session with a prominent Israeli educator, bringing us even closer to our Jewish history and culture.

Track - TOUR JERUSALEM Choose from a wide choice of options that will be geared to the first-timer, frequent visitor and those in-between.

TOUR JERUSALEM TRACK OPTIONS

VISIT A HADASSAH PROJECT

- 1 HADASSAH MOUNT SCOPUS** Meet with medical personnel and take an in-depth tour of Hadassah's first medical center at Mount Scopus.
- 2 HADASSAH COLLEGE** Visit the Hadassah College campus to meet with staff and students as we learn about the various academic programs being offered. Learn about the community services offered by the College, as well as its recent certification as a "green campus."
- 3 BEIT AR-EL** At Beit Ar-El, the renovated headquarters of Young Judaea, meet with Young Judaea Year Course participants to hear firsthand about their unique Israel experience and activities.

EXPLORE A MUSEUM

- 4 YAD VASHEM** Experience Israel's Holocaust Memorial and Museum, where many moving exhibitions honor the memory of those who perished at the hands of the Nazis. Memorials we will visit include the Hall of Names and the Avenue of the Righteous Among the Nations.
- 5 HAR HERZL AND THE HERZL MUSEUM** Visit the gravesites of Theodor Herzl, Golda Meir, Yitzhak Rabin and other Israeli dignitaries at the Har Herzl Cemetery. Continue to the Herzl Museum, where we learn about the life and work of the great Zionist leaders.
- 6 BEGIN CENTER, RUSSIAN COMPOUND, ASIREI HAMACHTAROT MUSEUM** Tour the Menachem Begin Center, where interactive multimedia exhibitions detail the life of Menachem Begin and the history of the State of Israel. Continue to the Russian Compound, one of the oldest areas in Jerusalem, where we view the Underground Prisoners Museum. At the Asirei Hamachtarot Museum, we learn about the life of Jerusalemites before and after the War of Independence.
- 7 ISRAEL MUSEUM: FOCUS ON JUDAICA** Explore the Israel Museum, with a special focus on the Judaica exhibits and the special exhibitions currently on display. The Jack, Joseph, and Morton Mandel Wing for Jewish Art and Life presents the religious artwork of Jewish communities worldwide, with works dating from the Middle Ages up to present times.
- 8 ISRAEL MUSEUM: SHRINE OF THE BOOK AND MODEL OF JERUSALEM** Our trip to the Israel Museum will take us to the Shrine of the Book, where the Dead Sea Scrolls, along with many other ancient artifacts, are preserved and displayed. We then view the fascinating Model of Jerusalem as it stood during the Time of the Second Temple, recreated to-scale in stunning detail.

ISRAEL'S POLICIES AND POLITICS

- 9 SHILO** Travel in a protected bus just north of Beit El, where we visit with community members in the Shilo settlement, and learn from them about the history of their community and life beyond the green line. There is a \$30 surcharge for this option.
- 10 GUSH ETZION** Travel to Gush Etzion in a protected bus, hear about the history of attempted settlement in this area before the War of Independence and learn about the modern development of the communities here. Speak with local residents about their successes and the challenges they face. Visit the museum and the bunker. There is a \$30 surcharge for this option.
- 11 MUSEUM ON THE SEAM AND THE SECURITY FENCE** Learn about the current security and border issues in Israel as we view the widely discussed security fence. Visit the Museum on the Seam, where socio-political exhibitions communicate ideas of peace and coexistence.

TOUR JERUSALEM TRACK OPTIONS

- 12 JERUSALEM DURING THE SIX-DAY WAR** Learn about the Six Day War as we visit locations throughout Jerusalem that played an important part in the 1967 War. Begin at the Tomb of Samuel and continue to Mt. Scopus and Ammunition Hill, sights of intense battles, now serving as living memorials to those who gave their lives in defense of the country. We end our day at the Western Wall with new appreciation for our ability to visit this holy site.
- 13 GREATER JERUSALEM** Enjoy a comfortable bus tour of the communities surrounding Jerusalem. See first-hand these areas which are frequently in the news.

HISTORY AND ARCHEOLOGY

- 14 JERUSALEM UNDER SIEGE** Take a ride along Israel's "Burma Road" in a beautiful Jewish National Fund forest. We'll discuss Israel's strategic defenses and important military outposts during the War of Independence, and the important role General Mickey Marcus played in the construction of the road. There is a \$40 surcharge for this option.
- 15 RABBINICAL TUNNELS AND THE DAVIDSON CENTER** Discover the wonders of ancient Jerusalem, beginning with a visit to the Davidson Center, where multimedia exhibitions detail the history and construction of the Temple Mount area. Continue with a fascinating tour of the Western Wall Tunnels running underneath the Temple Mount.
- 16 IR DAVID** Explore the well-preserved archaeological wonder of Ir David. Relive King David's conquest of Jerusalem over 3,000 years ago as we discover the amazing new excavations and the water system.
- 17 HERODIAN MANSIONS AND BURNT HOUSE** Discover life as it was during the time of the Second Temple. Visit the Burnt House, destroyed a month after the Second Temple fell, for an audio-visual presentation with fascinating details about the ancient days of Jerusalem. At the Herodian Mansions, discover how the wealthiest Jerusalemites lived over 2,000 years ago.
- 18 RACHEL'S TOMB AND YAD LAKASHISH** Visit the burial place of the biblical matriarch Rachel, wife of Jacob and mother of two of his twelve sons. Rachel's Tomb, considered by Jews as the third holiest site, has become an important place of Jewish pilgrimage, especially for Jewish women. Perform mitzvah when visiting Yad Lakashish, "Lifeline for the Old."
- 19 HURVA SYNAGOGUE AND THE TEMPLE INSTITUTE** Discover the ancient Hurva Synagogue in Jerusalem's Old City, which recently underwent an extensive renovation. Learn about the Temple Institute, dedicated to the rebuilding of the Holy Temple, and the recent reconstruction of the holy vessels of the Temple.

CULTURE

- 20 SCAVENGER HUNT** Participate in an engaging and friendly scavenger hunt that will familiarize us with Jerusalem's beautiful neighborhoods and historical landmarks.
- 21 JERUSALEM ART TOUR** Meet with local Jerusalem artists, including a jeweler, a pottery-maker, and a painter. Visit the artists' galleries and learn about their inspirations and techniques as we view their works.
- 22 CULINARY TOUR** Experience traditional Israeli food on a chef-led tour through Machane Yehuda market, followed by a hands-on cooking lesson as we prepare delicious Middle Eastern snacks. There is a \$160 surcharge for this option.

HOTEL DESCRIPTIONS

KING DAVID

Israel's most famous and luxurious European-style hotel is considered to be the grand dame of Israel's hotels. Located across from the Old City walls, minutes away by foot or car. Guest rooms are spacious with large, well-appointed bathrooms. The King David offers a magnificent outdoor swimming pool and gardens, several superior dining options, health club, hair salon and shops. Two room categories: Deluxe New City view and Deluxe Old City view.

DAVID CITADEL

Among the best locations in Jerusalem. The David Citadel is a beautiful, contemporary American-style hotel. Located across from the Jaffa Gate and Mamila Mall and within walking distance of the Old City. Guest rooms are spacious with well-appointed bathrooms. The hotel has a variety of dining options, an indoor/outdoor swimming pool, hair salon, shops, health club and spa. Two room categories: Superior New City view and Deluxe Old City view. Executive lounge privileges are available at an additional charge.

INBAL

The Inbal Hotel overlooks the Old City and Liberty Bell Park. This hotel prides itself on being warm and friendly, providing quality service. The attractive guest rooms have modern bathrooms. There is a new health club and spa, outdoor or indoor swimming, hair salon, several popular shops, and good dining options. The Inbal is an easy walk to the German Colony's beautiful boutiques and restaurant row. Executive lounge privileges are available at an additional charge.

LEONARDO PLAZA (formerly Sheraton Plaza)

Centrally located opposite the Great Synagogue, the Leonardo Plaza is a luxury hotel offering attractive rooms. It is easy walking distance to Jerusalem's downtown shops, restaurants and the Old City. There is a large, beautiful lobby, several excellent dining options, outdoor swimming pool, health club, hair salon and shops.

DAN JERUSALEM (formerly the Regency)

New to the Dan Group, this contemporary hotel, cascading down from Mt. Scopus, has magnificent vistas of the Old City. It is a seven-minute ride by car to downtown. There are two dining options, indoor and outdoor pools, a large, well-equipped health club, tennis court, spa and shops.

CROWNE PLAZA

This skyscraper is the first building you see as you approach Jerusalem at the entrance to the city. It is near the Knesset, Israel Museum and Convention Center. The views in all directions are breathtaking. Guest rooms are decorated with contemporary furnishings. The hotel has three dining options, including a glatt kosher Indian restaurant, a newly renovated outdoor swimming pool, new spa and health club and several popular shops. Executive lounge privileges are available for an additional charge.

DAN PANORAMA

The Dan Panorama is centrally located within easy reach of the Old and New Cities. The hotel has a pleasant setting and friendly staff. Guest rooms are small, but comfortable. The lobby and dining area have been beautifully renovated. The hotel has two dining options, hair salon and a health club. Executive lounge privileges are available for an additional charge.

HOTEL DESCRIPTIONS

MOUNT ZION

Located near the German Colony, the core of the Mount Zion hotel is a 19th century building with special charm and old world character in a spectacular setting. The hotel overlooks biblical landscapes and stunning views of the Old City. Guest rooms, which vary in size and design, were recently redecorated. The outdoor swimming pool is located in the hotel's beautiful gardens. Other amenities include a fitness center, full service spa and two dining options.

RAMADA

Part of the complex that makes up the largest hotel in Israel, the Ramada Hotel is situated near the entrance to the city and is within walking distance of the Israel Museum and the Knesset. Comfortable guest rooms have good views. The hotel has an indoor and an outdoor swimming pool, tennis court, shops, health club and several restaurants.

PRIMA ROYALE (formerly Windmill)

The Prima Royale is the first boutique hotel in Jerusalem, centrally located on a quiet street in the Talbieh district. It is a small, charming hotel focusing on art and culture, which are reflected in the décor. Guest rooms were recently redecorated and the bathrooms have been renovated. The hotel has a restaurant and small health club.

PRIMA KINGS

The Prima Kings Hotel is well situated next to the Great Synagogue, within walking distance to the Old City and an easy walk to downtown Jerusalem's shops and restaurants. There are two restaurants and a lobby bar. All of the guest rooms have been redecorated. PLEASE NOTE: There are a few steps at the entrance to the lobby.

KING SOLOMON

Overlooking Liberty Bell Park and the Old City, the King Solomon Hotel offers large, comfortable, recently refurbished guest rooms. The hotel is well located and near downtown shopping and restaurants. The hotel has three restaurants, several shops, an outdoor swimming pool and free parking. Daily services are conducted in the hotel synagogue.

REGISTRATION

Each person registering must complete a registration form and send it to Ayelet Tours by email, fax or regular mail. A \$500 deposit per person is required to confirm your reservation.

MEMBERSHIP

Women over the age of 17 years old are required to be annual or life members of Hadassah.

CONFIRMATIONS

Confirmations will be sent electronically, unless regular mail is requested.

TRAVEL

Ayelet Tours has airline seats on reserve for the Hadassah Convention, on several departure days, to and from Israel. They will be happy to make your international and domestic travel arrangements. They will also customize a trip for you in Israel or in combination with other countries.

BUSINESS AND FIRST CLASS UPGRADES

Flying First or Business Class is comfortable, but considerably more costly. Despite this, these premium seats on all airlines are desirable and sell quickly. Ayelet Tours will make reservations for you on a first come, first served basis. We strongly recommend reserving early.

DEPARTURE CITIES

Non-stop flights on several airlines are available from the United States; there are also a number of gateway cities to transatlantic carriers. Please contact Ayelet Tours for specific information and prices.

TRANSFERS

Group transportation to and from Ben Gurion Airport on October 15, 18 and 19 for Convention, and for the days of arrival and departure for pre and post tours, will be provided. Transfers on other dates are available from Ayelet Tours at an additional charge.

GENERAL INFORMATION

HOTELS

All of the hotels selected offer nice standard room accommodations. Upgraded rooms and suites may be available; please check with Ayelet Tours. Most guest rooms are small and not suitable for triples. Should you wish a triple room, please check with Ayelet Tours, as availability may be limited. Rooms with king size beds are also limited. All hotels have hair dryers, but most do not have clocks. Wi Fi is available in every hotel; most charge a fee.

ROOMMATES

Participants who would like to be paired with another delegate should make this request to Ayelet Tours. They will do their best to find a roommate with the same land package, but there is no guarantee that one will be found. If a roommate is not located by the participant or Ayelet Tours, the participant will be responsible for the additional charge for a single. Should a roommate cancel or prove to be unacceptable, single supplements will apply.

SINGLE ROOMS

A limited number of single rooms are available at each hotel for an additional charge. They will be reserved on a first come, first served basis.

MEALS

All land packages include a full Israeli breakfast each day, one lavish buffet dinner and one box lunch. All meals are kosher in Israel. Meals in Jordan are dairy. Lists for a wide variety of restaurants will be available from tour hostesses at each hotel. Please let us know if you have special dietary requirements in advance of the Convention.

SHABBAT

All Hadassah pre- and post- extensions observe Shabbat. Your tour guide and hostess at your hotel will have addresses of synagogues and suggestions for Shabbat activities.

GRATUITIES

\$90 per person will be pre- collected for tips to your guide, bus driver, wait staff and baggage handlers.

SPECIAL NEEDS

There may be some extensive walking at some of the sites we will visit; you must note any difficulty walking on the registration form. Wheelchairs are available by prior request. Should you require a wheelchair for even a part of the program, you must make your own arrangements for someone to help you. Guides, bus drivers and hostesses will not be available for wheelchair assistance with the exception of loading and unloading the wheelchair on and off the bus. Should you need a wheelchair, they must be reserved in advance. The cost for renting a wheelchair is \$50 for the duration of the time in Israel, which is a donation. Electric carts can be rented by prior request. However, they cannot be accommodated on the buses. Ayelet Tours can arrange for a private van with a hydraulic lift and furnish prices upon request.

DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS

Deposits of \$500 per person are required for registration. The balance for the amount due must be paid at least 60 (sixty) days prior to departure. Deposits and payments may be made by check or credit card.

CANCELLATIONS

Cancellations for Convention or pre- and post tours must be made in writing. Penalties, which are deducted from the deposit, are as follows:

ISRAEL, THE WEST BANK AND GAZA

June 22, 2011

The Department of State warns U.S. citizens of the risks of traveling to Israel, the West Bank, and the Gaza Strip, and about threats to themselves and to U.S. interests in those locations. The Department of State urges U.S. citizens to remain mindful of security factors when planning travel to Israel and the West Bank and to avoid all travel to the Gaza Strip. This replaces the Travel Warning issued August 10, 2010, to update information on the general security environment and to warn against participation in any attempt to reach Gaza by sea.

The Gaza Strip and Southern Israel

The Department of State strongly urges that U.S. citizens refrain from all travel to the Gaza Strip. This recommendation applies to all U.S. citizens. U.S. citizens should be aware that as a consequence of a longstanding prohibition on travel by U.S. citizen employees of the U.S. Government into the Gaza Strip, the ability of consular staff to offer timely assistance to U.S. citizens there is extremely limited, including the provision of routine consular services.

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) strictly controls the crossing points between Israel and the Gaza Strip. The security environment within Gaza, including its border with Egypt and its seacoast, is dangerous and volatile. U.S. citizens are advised against traveling to Gaza by any means, including via sea. Previous attempts to enter Gaza by sea have been stopped by Israeli naval vessels and resulted in the injury, death, arrest, and deportation of U.S. citizens. U.S. citizens participating in any effort to reach Gaza by sea should understand that they may face arrest, prosecution, and deportation by the Government of Israel. The Government of Israel has announced its intention to seek ten-year travel bans to Israel for anyone participating in an attempt to enter Gaza by sea. On May 31, 2010, nine people were killed, including one U.S. citizen, in such an attempt. The U.S. Embassy in Tel Aviv and the U.S. Consulate General in Jerusalem are not able to provide consular assistance in Gaza or on the high seas or coastal waters.

From December 27, 2008, through January 17, 2009, Israel conducted a military operation in Gaza. Israel and Hamas, a State Department-designated Foreign Terrorist Organization that violently seized power in Gaza in June 2007, declared separate truces to end the fighting. Small clashes continue to occur along the boundary of the Gaza Strip. Rockets and mortars are still fired into Israel from Gaza, and Israel continues to conduct military operations inside Gaza, including airstrikes. Israel has also declared an exclusion zone inside Gaza along its boundary with Israel and has taken lethal measures against individuals who enter it. The Rafah crossing between Egypt and Gaza is open, but it does not operate full time, and U.S. citizens are not always able to leave Gaza at a time of their choosing.

In the past, some rockets have traveled more than 40 km (24 miles) from Gaza and landed as far north as Yavne and Gadera and as far east as Beersheva. As a result of possible military operations by the Government of Israel in Gaza and the ever-present risk of rocket and mortar attacks into Israel from Gaza, U.S. government personnel travelling in the vicinity of the Gaza Strip boundary, to include the city of Sderot, require approval from the Embassy's Regional Security Office. U.S. citizens in the area should be aware of the risks and should take note of announcements by the Government of Israel's office of Homefront Command.

DISCLAIMER

The West Bank

The Department of State urges U.S. citizens to exercise caution when traveling to the West Bank. Palestinian Authority (PA) security forces are now deployed in all major cities and other limited areas within the West Bank. As a result, violence in recent years has decreased markedly throughout the West Bank. Nonetheless, demonstrations and violent incidents can occur without warning. Vehicles have also been the target of rocks, Molotov cocktails and gunfire on West Bank roads. The IDF continues to carry out security operations in the West Bank. Israeli security operations, including incursions in Palestinian population centers, can occur at any time and lead to disturbances and violence. U.S. citizens can be caught in the middle of potentially dangerous situations. Some U.S. citizens involved in demonstrations in the West Bank have sustained serious injuries in confrontations with Israeli security forces. The State Department recommends that U.S. citizens, for their own safety, avoid demonstrations.

During periods of unrest, the Israeli Government sometimes closes off access to the West Bank and those areas may be placed under curfew. All persons in areas under curfew should remain indoors to avoid risking arrest or injury. U.S. citizens have been killed, seriously injured, or detained and deported as a result of encounters with Israeli operations in the West Bank. Travel restrictions may be imposed by Israel with little or no warning. Strict measures have frequently been imposed following terrorist actions, and the movement of Palestinian Americans, both those with residency status in the West Bank or Gaza as well as foreign passport holders, has been severely impeded. Security conditions in the West Bank can hinder the ability of consular staff to offer timely assistance to U.S. citizens.

Jerusalem

The Department of State urges U.S. citizens to remain vigilant while traveling throughout Jerusalem, including in commercial and downtown areas of West Jerusalem. Spontaneous or planned protests within the Old City are possible, especially after Friday prayers. Some of these protests have led to violent clashes. Travelers should exercise caution at religious sites on holy days, Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. Isolated street protests and demonstrations can also occur in areas of East Jerusalem, including around Salah Ed-Din Street, Damascus Gate, Silwan and the Sheikh Jarrah neighborhood. U.S. Government employees are authorized to visit the Old City from 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m., but not between 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. on Fridays. The area of the ramparts on the city wall between Herod's Gate and Lion's Gate is off-limits to U.S. Government personnel at all times. The Sherover or Haas Promenade (scenic overlook) located in Armon Hanatziv is open to U.S. Government personnel during daylight hours only. Official personnel and their family members are prohibited from using public buses and bus terminals or stations.

Travel Restrictions for U.S. Government Personnel

Personal travel in the West Bank for U.S. Government personnel and their families is allowed for limited mission-approved purposes in the areas described below. They may travel to Bethlehem on weekends and holidays during daylight hours only and to Jericho on weekends and holidays; and transit through the West Bank using Routes 1 and 90 to reach the Allenby/King Hussein Bridge, or the Dead Sea coast near Ein Gedi and Masada. They also may travel north on Route 90 from the Allenby/King Hussein Bridge to the Sea of Galilee. Use of these routes is approved for transit purposes during daylight hours, with stops permitted only at roadside facilities on Highways 1 and 90. Personal travel also is permitted to Qumran National Park off Route 90 by the Dead Sea, and all areas south of Highway 1 and east of route 90 (Dead Sea area). Each transit requires prior notification to the Consulate General's security office.

U.S. Government personnel and family members are permitted both official and personal travel on Route 443 between Modi'in and Jerusalem without prior notification between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. only. All other personal travel in the West Bank, unless specifically authorized for mission-approved purposes, is prohibited.

DISCLAIMER

General Safety and Security

Israeli authorities remain concerned about the continuing threat of terrorist attacks. U.S. citizens are cautioned that a greater danger may exist around restaurants, businesses, and other places associated with U.S. interests and/or located near U.S. official buildings, such as the U.S. Embassy in Tel Aviv and the U.S. Consulate General in Jerusalem. U.S. citizens are also urged to exercise a high degree of caution and to use common sense when patronizing restaurants, nightclubs, cafes, malls, places of worship, and theaters, especially during peak hours. Large crowds and public gatherings have been targeted by terrorists in the past and should be avoided to the extent practicable. U.S. Government personnel have been directed to avoid protests and demonstrations and urged to maintain a high level of vigilance and situational awareness at all times. U.S. citizens should take into consideration that public buses, and their respective terminals are “off-limits” to U.S. Government personnel.

Two U.S. citizens were murdered in separate incidents while walking in the woods in the Beit Shemesh area near Jerusalem in the last 18 months. Israeli authorities characterized the murders as terrorist attacks.

A bomb blast near the Central Bus Terminal in Jerusalem on March 23, 2011 injured several U.S. citizens.

In the Golan Heights and West Bank, there are live landmines in many areas and visitors should walk only on established roads or trails.

Entry/Exit Difficulties

U.S. citizens planning to travel to Israel or the West Bank should read carefully the detailed information concerning entry and exit difficulties in the Country Specific Information sheet. U.S. citizens in Israel, the West Bank, and the Gaza Strip are strongly encouraged to enroll with the Consular Sections of the U.S. Embassy in Tel Aviv or the U.S. Consulate General in Jerusalem through the State Department’s Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP). Occasional warden messages issued by the Embassy and the Consulate General are e-mailed to registered U.S. citizens and are posted on State Department websites to highlight time-sensitive security concerns.
