

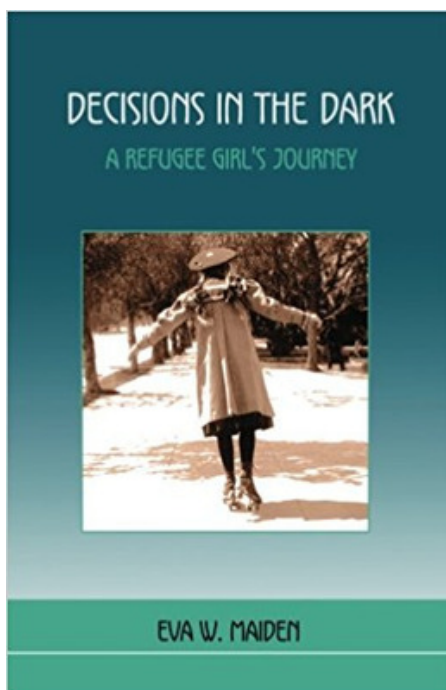
## THE JEWISH REFUGEE EXPERIENCE REMEMBERED WITH EVA MAIDEN



Following decades of working in the mental health field, Eva Maiden delves into her own personal history. “Decisions in the Dark – a Refugee Girl’s Journey” describes her family’s experiences in Nazi occupied Austria, and their eventual resettlement in the U.S. Her depiction of childhood memories grant readers a glimpse into the refugee experience.

Today, the UN estimates that there are 22.5 million refugees worldwide. Eva will also share her experiences in helping survivor communities of the Bay Area to form groups on their own behalf.

*Eva Maiden is the daughter of two psychoanalysts who attended Freud's lectures at University of Vienna. After an internship at Henry Gunn High School, Eva worked for twenty years as a school psychologist, and later as a psychotherapist in Palo Alto, where her interests focused on family therapy and women's development over their life span. Early in the 1900's Eva began to apply her professional skills to meet the needs of holocaust survivors, and since her retirement continues to volunteer.*
