Thanks to the work of those who came before us, Houston Hadassah has thrived and grown. A new group in the Woodlands area, Aviv, formed and many new members were "gifted" with an annual membership in Hadassah. Thanks to Linda Block's Mazel Tov Mommy and Mazel Tov Bubbie campaign, many children were given life membership in Hadassah. The past year saw us raise money to support Hadassah projects, through appeals, a fabulous Chai Event, and an inspiring Big Gifts event. We heard about what was happening in Israel and our Hadassah Medical Organization from Barbara Sofer and Michael Weiss and learned about Curriculum Watch from Sandra Alonsi. Carol Gaines and her team informed women about breast health. We made sandwiches for SEARCH, gave books, toiletries and clothing to the needy and supported community projects across town. 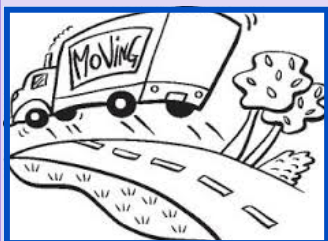

DR. SANDRA ALFONSI UPDATES HOUSTON CHAPTER ON CURRICULUM WATCH

Dr. Sandra Alfonsi, member of Hadassah's National Board, spoke at the Houston Chapter office about her work with Hadassah's Curriculum Watch of which she is Chair. Dr. Alfonsi and her advisory board review U.S. high school social studies textbooks for revisionism, anti-Semitism and anti-Zionism. Examples of revisionism include the mischaracterization of the State of Israel and its formation; exclusion of any reference to the contribution of American Jews such as Hyman Solomon's role in funding the American revolutionary war; Emma Lazarus's poem that graces the base of the Statue of Liberty; David Dubinsky's role in the women's labor union movement; and the Jewish role in the Civil Rights Movement among other topics.

Dr. Alfonsi reported that her work on revisionism has changed considerably over the years. Initially she dealt with Holocaust revisionism in U.S. social studies textbooks. For example, the murder of six million Jews has been described as collateral damage of World War II; in other words they were at the wrong place at the wrong time. Of late, her work has focused on how textbook publishers address and characterize terrorism and the State of Israel. Textbook authors have also introduced the concept of Islamic Holocaust revisionism. For instance some social studies textbooks will state the proposition that if there was no Holocaust there would be no state of Israel and if there was no state of Israel, then there would be no terrorism. Some textbooks fail to characterize 9/11 as a series of terrorist events. And finally, some textbooks have introduced the idea that the United States was founded on Judeo-Christian-Islamic traditions. Dr. Alfonsi will have a return engagement in the spring to speak at the Houston Holocaust Museum.

COMBAT HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN OUR COMMUNITY!

Jewish action day January 14 is co-sponsored nationally by Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America (HWZOA) and National Council for Jewish Women (NCJW).

The local event, "Hannah's Vision" will be held on Sunday, January 31 from 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm at Congregation Beth Israel. The talk features national expert Lori Cohen, community activist Kathryn Griffin and Special Advisor to the Mayor of Houston on Human Trafficking, Minal Patel Davis. The day is sponsored by NCJW Greater Houston Section, Congregation Beth Israel Sisterhood, and Congregation Beth Israel Miriam Browning Learning Center.

Lori Cohen, Director of the Anti-Trafficking Initiative at Sanctuary for Families Center for Battered Women's Legal Services in New York will offer insights on how to organize to fight human trafficking.

Kathryn Griffin is founder of *We've Been There, Done That*, a program she designed to help prevent sex workers and drug addicts from returning to lives of crime. A reformed drug addict who turned to prostitution to support her habit, she will share her experiences with traffickers and the trafficked.

The program will close with Minal Patel Davis, Special Advisor to the Mayor on Human Trafficking for Houston, who will provide an update on local efforts to address the trafficking issues as we approach two major draws for human traffickers: the Final Four in April 2016 and Super Bowl 2017. She will also highlight what we can do, collectively and individually, to combat human trafficking.
